LPN to BSN Track 95 credit hours

The LPN to BSN program is an accelerated program for Licensed Practical Nurses who wish to become a registered nurse with a bachelor's degree in nursing. It can be completed full time in as little as 7 semesters. Successful students will obtain the Bachelor of Science in nursing degree (BSN)) and are eligible to take the licensure examination for registered professional nurse (RN).

Applicants for this program must have an LPN degree from an accredited technical program and meet the general requirements of West Virginia Wesleyan College. New cohorts are accepted each fall semester.

A minimum of 120 credit hours are required for graduation. 25 hours of credit will be escrowed from the LPN program.
