## INTEGRATED STUDIES MAJOR (INTEG.BA)

The Bachelor of Arts in Integrated Studies provides students the opportunity to investigate topics, interests, or issues that cannot be addressed through a single minor degree of study. The B.A. in Integrated Studies allows the student to choose three (3) existing minors from academic units in the college and combine them to form the bachelor's degree tailored to their interest and career goals.
