Master of Science in Nursing Family Nurse Practitioner

West Virginia Wesleyan College offers an advanced practice nursing concentration: **Family Nurse Practitioner.**

This program of study focuses on preparing advanced practice nurses uniquely qualified to provide primary health care to patients. Family Nurse Practitioners diagnose and manage acute and chronic conditions and emphasize health promotion and disease prevention. They practice autonomously and in collaboration with other health care professionals to manage patients' healthcare needs. They are prepared through academic graduate programs with both didactic and clinical experiences. Coursework will be offered using online and hybrid learning methods. Some brief oncampus residencies are required. Practicum experiences will be arranged in students' home communities. Following completion of the curricula, students may sit for the National Certification Examination as Family Nurse Practitioners (AANP or ANCC).

Candidates for Admission

Program Policies: All applicants will be considered individually by the Graduate Admission Committee. Once admitted, students must maintain an unencumbered WV RN license and a 3.0 GPA for all graduate work. Students must complete the program in five years. Applicants will not be accepted for January admission. Students will be admitted as a cohort group for Fall; admission is competitive to the program.

Each applicant will:

- Be a graduate of an accredited BSN program
- Possess an unencumbered RN license
- Have a GPA of 3.0 or higher in all previous college work
- Complete the application for graduate admission to the MSN program, available at www.wvwc.edu/admissions/graduate-students
- Provide a personal statement of goals & objectives
- Provide official transcripts for all collegiate coursework
- Submit a current resume or curriculum vitae
- Submit three professional recommendations for Graduate Admission forms, available at www.wvwc.edu/admissions/graduate-students,
 which must be from a professional supervisors or faculty members
- Submit validation of an unencumbered RN license
- Demonstrate proficiency in English if a non-native English speaker by submitting scores from the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)
