Candidates for Admission

Once admitted, students must maintain an unencumbered WV RN license and a 3.0 GPA for all graduate work. Students must complete the program in five years. Applicants will not be accepted for January admission. Students will be admitted for Fall and admission is competitive. **Each applicant will:**

- Be a graduate of an accredited BSN program
- Possess an unencumbered RN license
- Have a GPA of 3.0 or higher in all previous college work
- Complete the application for graduate admission to the MSN program, available at <u>www.wvwc.edu/admissions/graduate-students</u>
- Provide a personal statement of goals & objectives
- Provide official transcripts for all collegiate coursework
- Submit a current resume or curriculum vitae
- Submit three professional recommendation for Graduate Admission forms, one of which must be from a professional supervisor or faculty
- Submit validation of an unencumbered RN license
- Demonstrate proficiency in English if a non-native English speaker by submitting scores from the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)
