## West Virginia Wesleyan College CARES Act Required Reporting

West Virginia Wesleyan College has signed and returned the to the Department of Education the Certification and Agreement to receive funds under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act and intends to use no less than 50 percent of the funds received for Emergency Financial Grants to students. The College received \$621,279 for disbursement to students. 704 students enrolled at West Virginia Wesleyan College are eligible to participate in this program. An additional 174 students were enrolled in the spring 2020 semester and have either graduated or formally notified the College that they are not returning in the Fall. West Virginia Wesleyan continues to wait on clarification from the Department of Education as to the eligibility of these students to receive funds. As of May 22, 2020, the College has issued checks to 704 students for a total disbursement of \$334,000.

West Virginia Wesleyan College utilized a tiered approach based on 2019-2020 Estimated Family Contribution to determine how much students would be provided in the initial disbursement. All students that filed the 2019-2020 FAFSA received an initial disbursement. The chart below indicates how the amount was determined. Beginning June 1st, students will have the opportunity to apply for additional funds if the original disbursement does not cover all Covid-19 related costs due to the disruption of campus operations.
