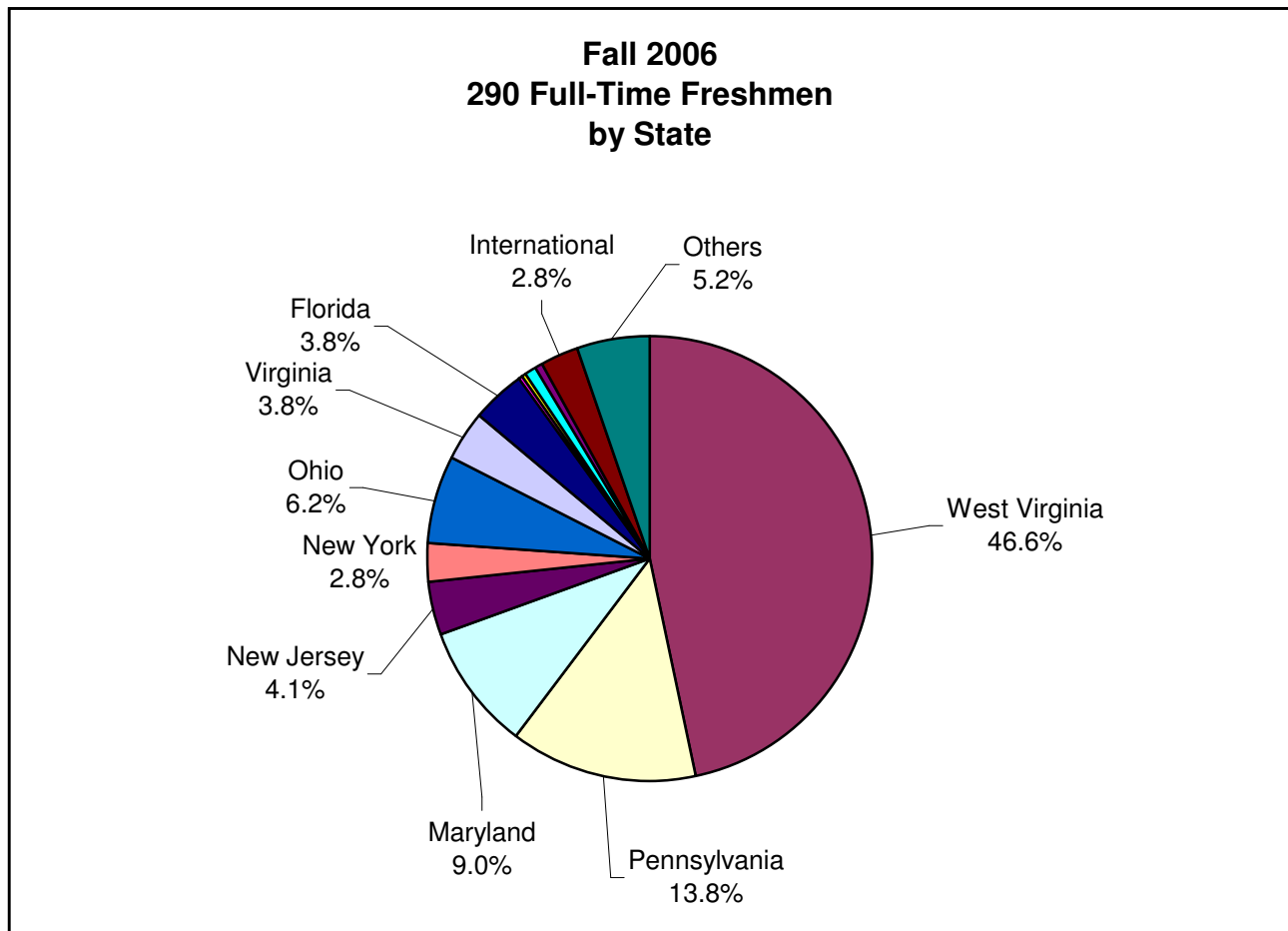

Fall 2002-2006 Full-Time Freshmen Enrollment Funnel and Academic Profile

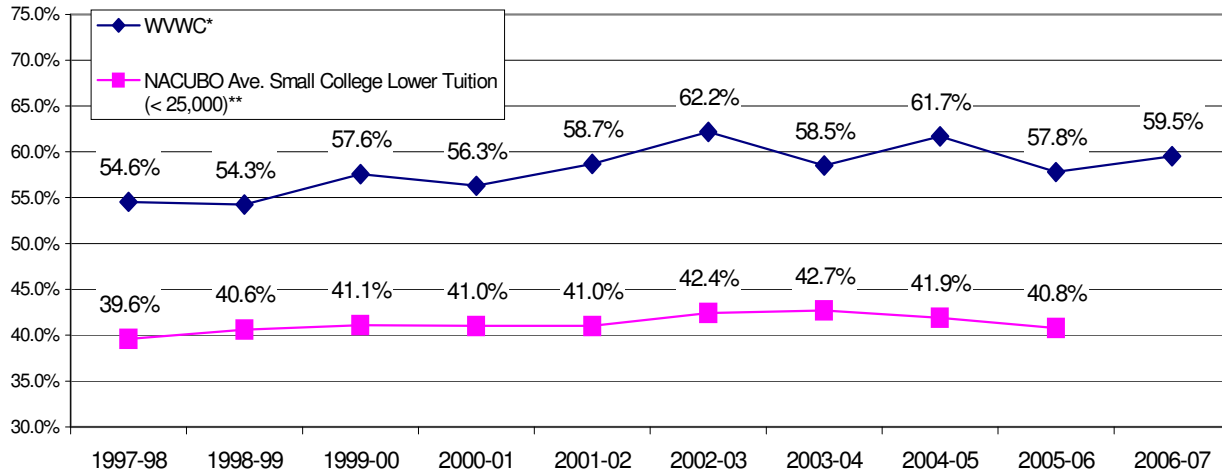

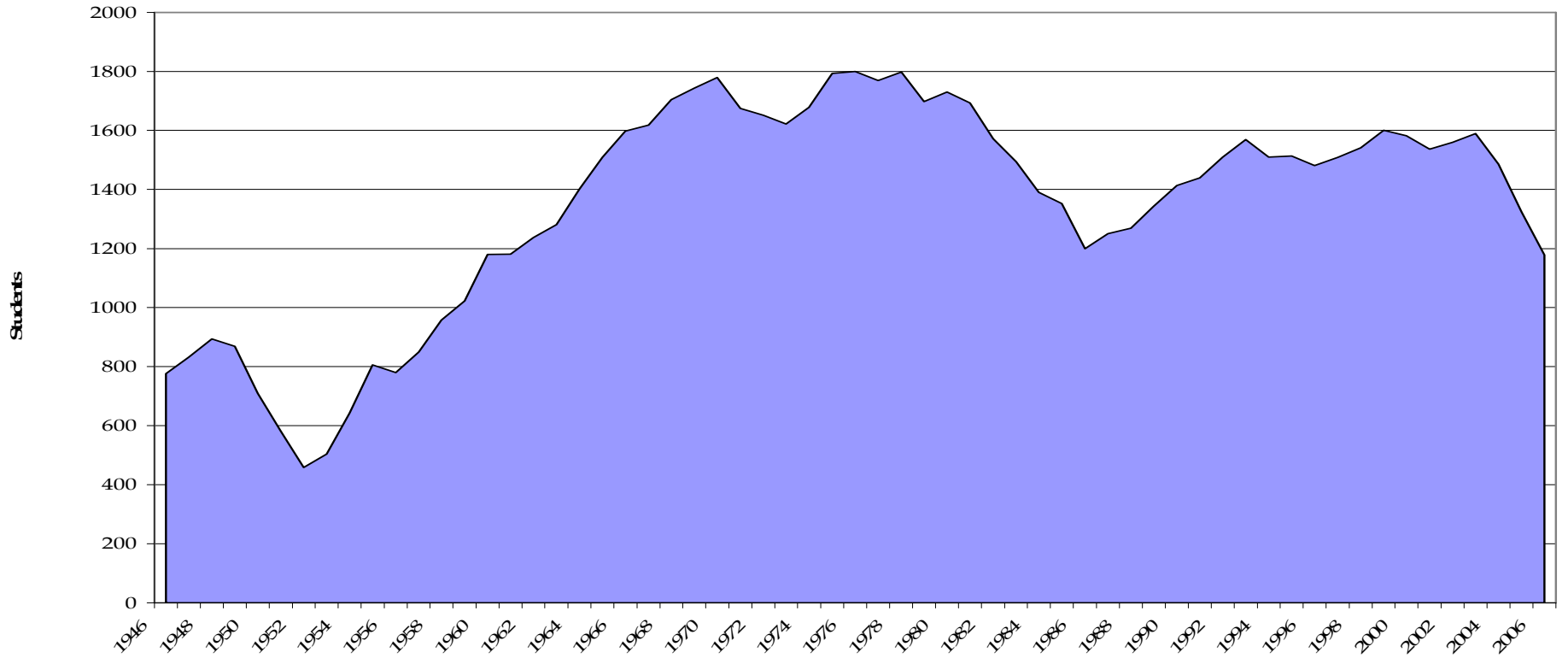

****Distance Education** is an academic extension of West Virginia Wesleyan College, offering college-level courses designed for home study by students not enrolled in a campus based post-secondary program of study. In the Fall 1996 a rolling enrollment style registration was implemented in which a student could register for courses anytime during the year. The number listed here is as of the official date of enrollment for Fall.

***** The MBA Program** redefined full-time status from 9 credit hours to 6 credit hours per semester for Fall 1999. This change will inflate the number of full-time and FTE student compared to previous years. The figure that should be used to compare to prior years is the Head Count Enrollment.

Fall 2001 was the first year for tracking of 5 Year MBA Students. These students will be officially counted in the Undergraduate Headcount and FTE numbers but are also enrolled in one or more masters level courses.

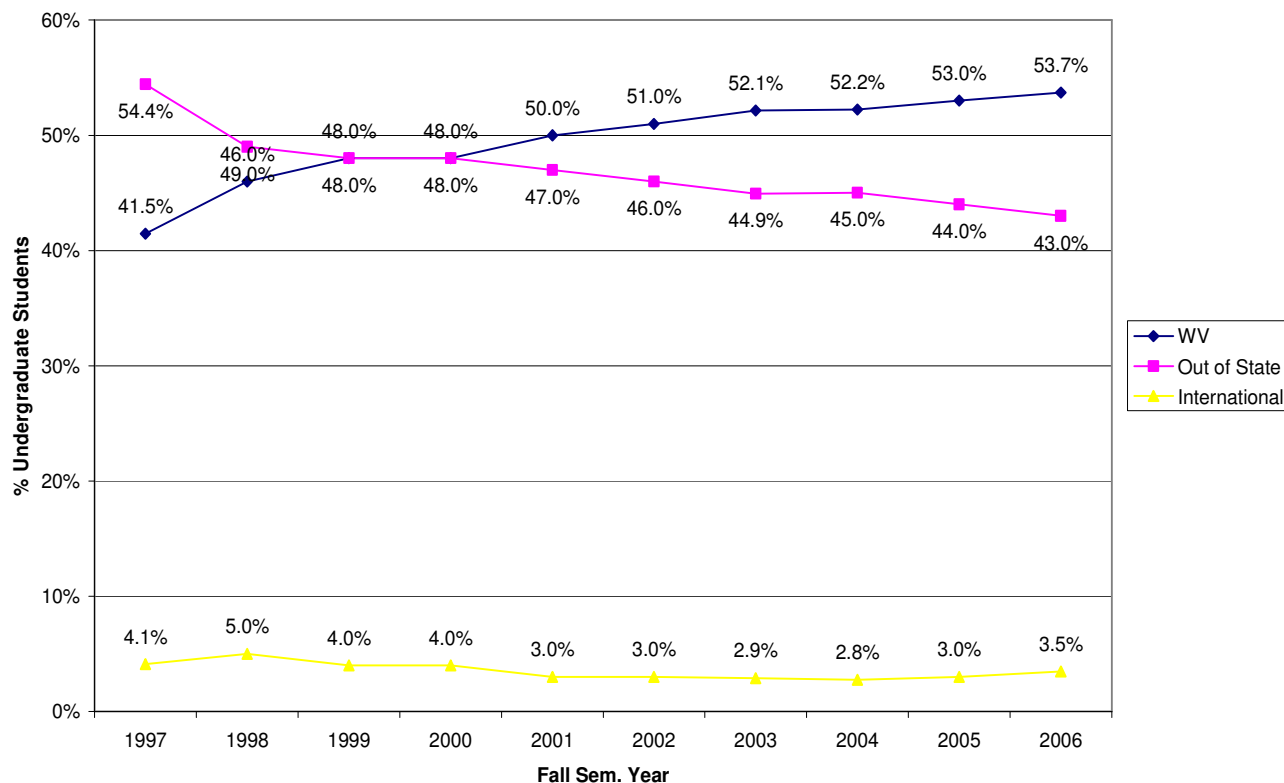

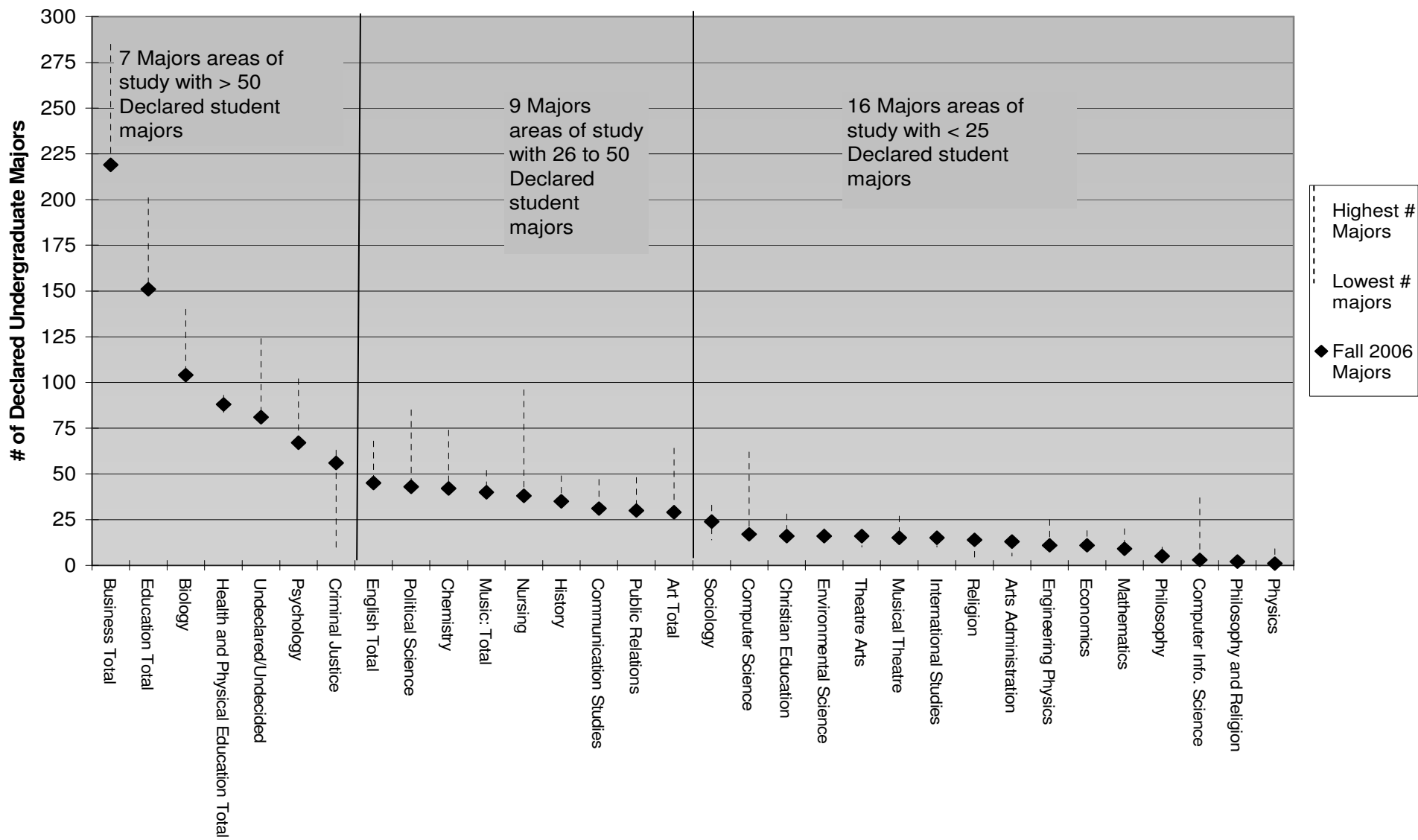

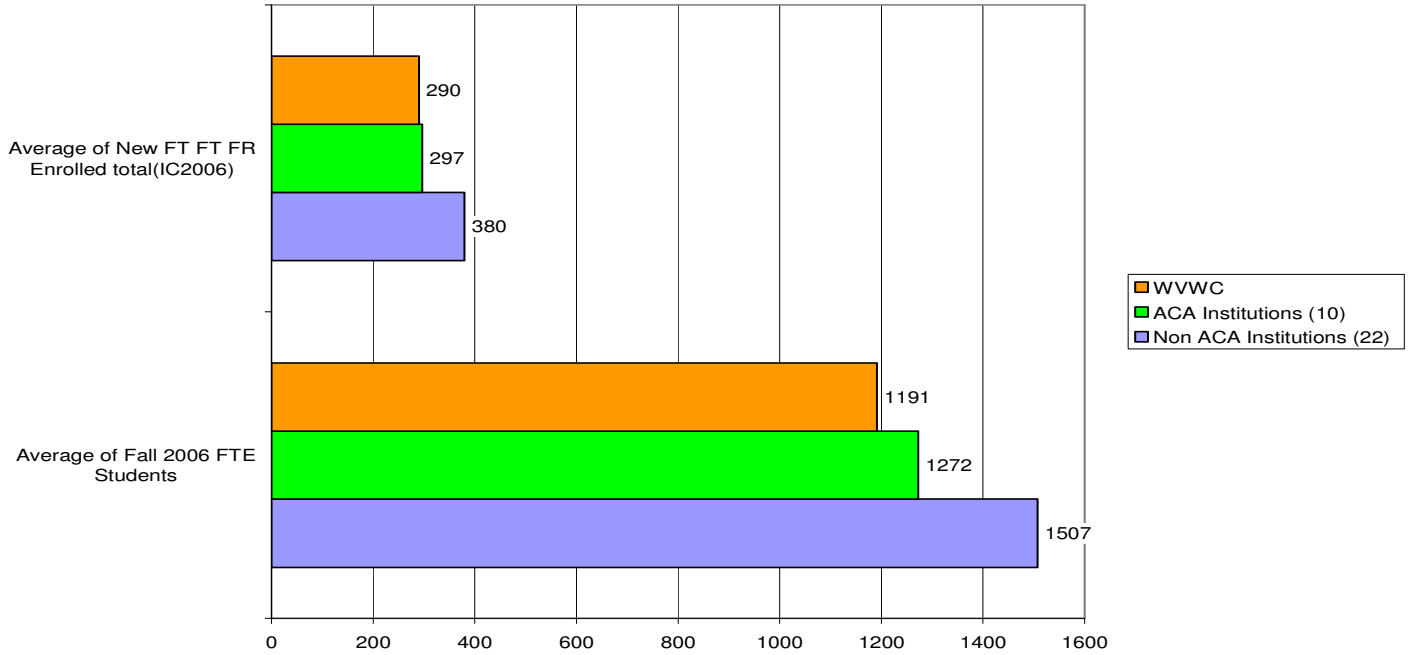

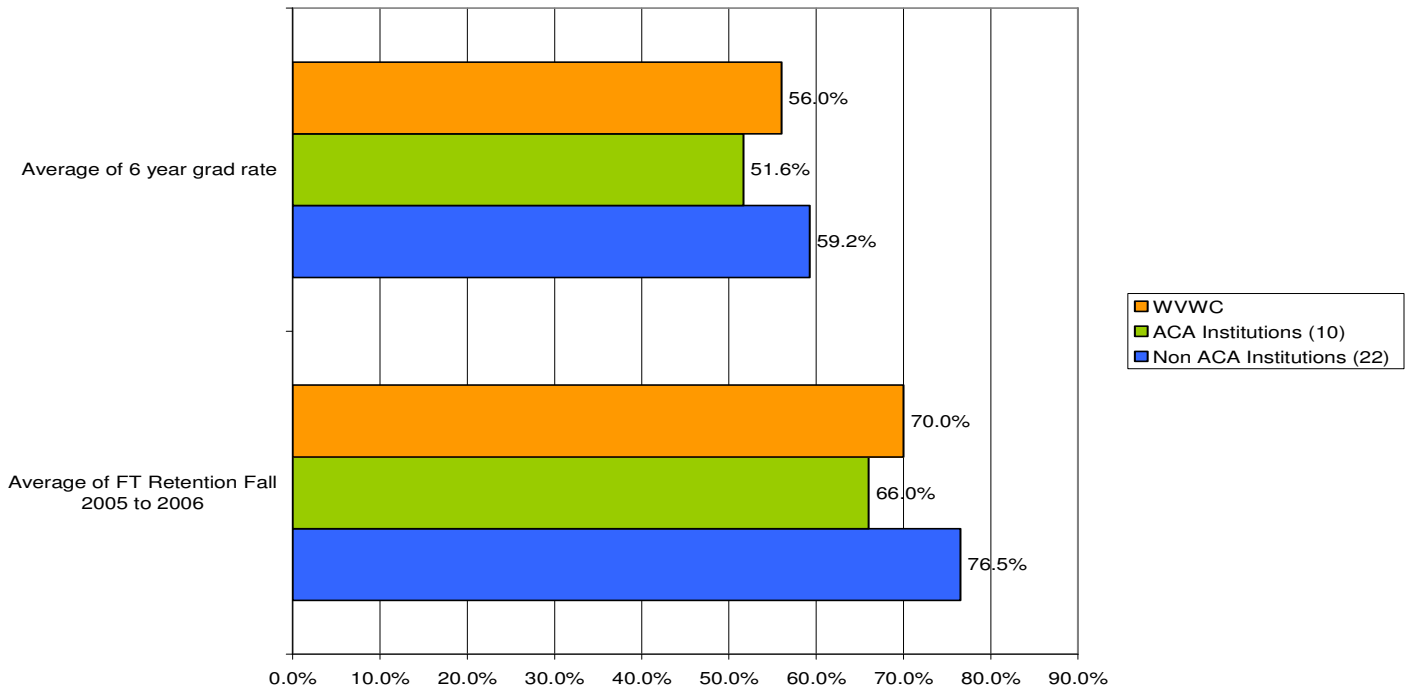

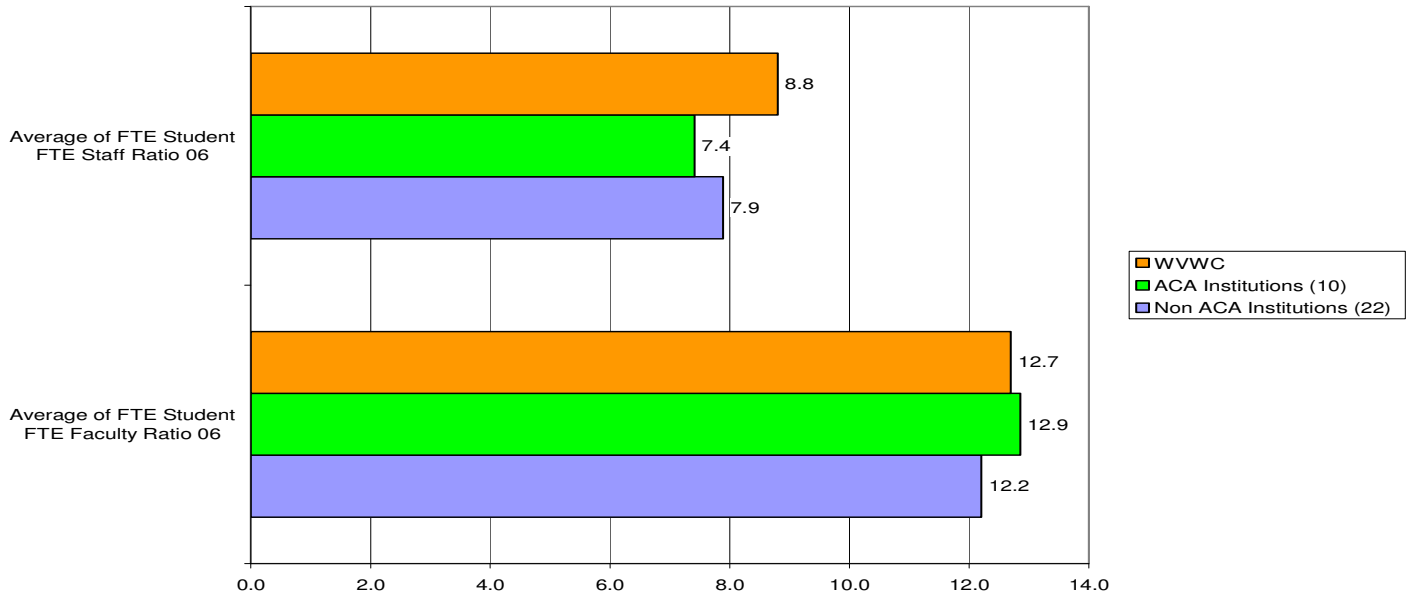


Graduation and First Year Retention Rates

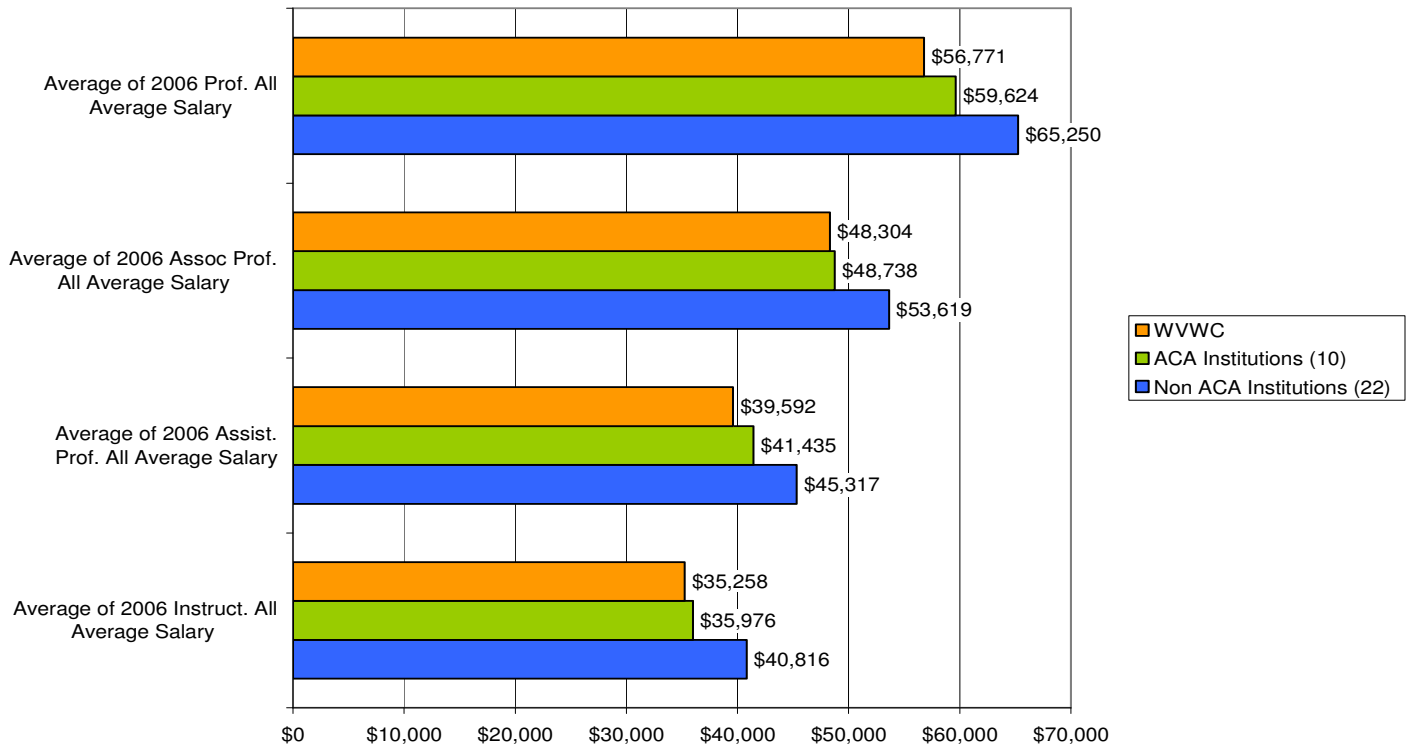

2006-07 Instructional Faculty Salaries by Rank

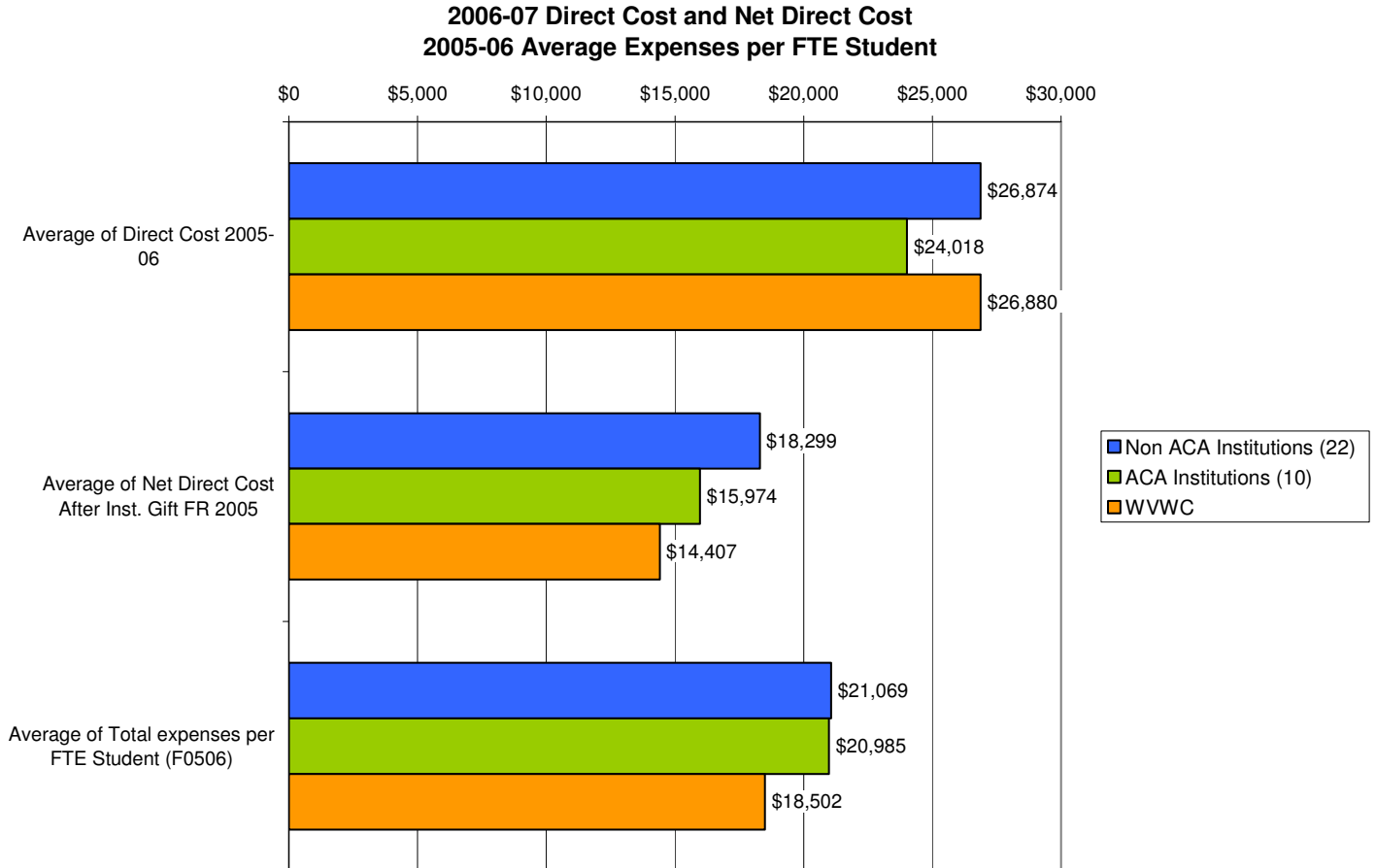
