- 5. Submission of two letters of recommendation from faculty members outside the Department of Education who have had the student in the classroom.
- 6. Submission of an autobiographical statement.
- 7. Evidence of a current, negative T.B. test
- 8. Completion of the dispositions evaluation.
- 9. Signed release form for Praxis scores.
