WVWC Financial Aid

Have you completed the FAFSA?

The FAFSA must be completed in order for a student to receive federal or state financial aid. Some scholarship opportunities also require you to complete the FAFSA.

To complete the FAFSA, go to www.studentaid.gov.

The FAFSA application must be renewed each year in order for you to receive federal or state financial aid (including federal Direct Loans).

Complete your FAFSA as soon as possible after October 1 each year for the following academic year.

Federal and State Financial Aid Updates

Maximum Federal Pell Grant is increasing from \$6495 to \$6895 for 2022-23

WV Higher Education Grant is increasing from \$3000 to \$3200 for 2022-23

WV Promise Scholarship is increasing from \$4750 to \$5000 for 2022-23

*****You must complete your FAFSA prior to April 15, 2022 to be considered for the WV Higher Education Grant*****

How do I find scholarships?

Places to Look:

- Your employer and/or your parents' places of employment
- Churches
- Community Organizations
- Employers and professional organizations that are affiliated with your field of study
- Schools that you attended
- Ask friends/family/professors (Networking)
- Online scholarship search engines

Online Scholarship Searches

The following list of websites may be useful in your scholarship search. Although these websites or scholarship search engines may assist you in finding scholarships that you may qualify for, you will still need to apply for each scholarship individually.

www.fastweb.com One of the most utilized financial aid search engines; searches for scholarships based on major, year in college, home state, interests, and career goals

www.collegeboard.org Based on need and/or merit; searches for scholarships based on major, race/ethnicity, home state, professional organizations, military service, learning disabilities and career goals

www.collegescholarships.com Provides searches for scholarships in various ways and provides sample essays

www.careeronestop.org This website, sponsored by the U.S. Department of Labor, contains a section on scholarships that may be filtered by several criteria including level of study, award type, where you live, and affiliation required.

www.umhcf.org United Methodist Higher Education Foundation offers scholarships that are available based on membership in United Methodist Church

www.gbhem.org The Higher Education & Ministry offers scholarships that are available based on membership in United Methodist Church

www.ycfwv.org Your Community Foundation offers a variety of scholarships to students from their area; if deadlines have passed for this year, please note these opportunities for next year. These scholarships are primarily based in West Virginia

www.central-scholarship.org Opportunities for students from Maryland and are based on several factors including major, areas of interest, community service and career goals

www.americorps.gov In exchange for service students earn money for college

You may also use your favorite search engine (i.e. Google or Bing) to search for scholarships. Be cautious in regards to possible scams.

Sweepstakes Scholarships

Some companies offer sweepstakes scholarships that require little effort to apply. Though these scholarships are legitimate, keep in mind that the number of students who enter is great. Also, these companies will use the information that you provide to market their products and services. Here are a few sweepstakes scholarships that you may apply for if you are interested:

pnc.com/scholarship PNC bank randomly selects six students every six months for \$2000 prize

citizensbank.com/scholarship Citizens Bank randomly selects students for \$2,500 monthly prizes and a \$15,000 annual grand prize

collegecovered.com/assist Discover Student Loans randomly selects students for a \$5,000 monthly prize

Tips and Information

- Apply for local scholarships
- Apply for scholarships with smaller awards
- Follow directions and satisfy all of the requirements
- Proofread/ask someone else to proofread
- Submit early-well before the deadline
- Take time to search and apply
- Find a strategy that works for you
- Keep track of what scholarships you have applied for, deadlines, and any other pertinent information

Tips and Information

(continued)

- Make a copy of your application and supporting materials
- Keep a resume on hand and update frequently
- Be involved in clubs, organizations, employment, and/or other activities that will help you stand out from other applicants
- Choose references who know you well and will speak highly of you
- Do NOT reuse essays without revising to make them specific to each scholarship

Avoid Scholarship Scams

- Protect your personal information
- Do not pay to apply
- Read the fine print
- Understand the terms and conditions

Outside Scholarships and other WVWC Financial Aid

Outside scholarships are added in addition to any other financial aid that you already receive as long as the guidelines for the scholarship allow and total financial aid does not exceed your cost of attendance.

If you are awarded an outside scholarship, you should provide the Financial Aid office with a copy of the award letter for the scholarship as soon as possible. We will add the scholarship to your financial aid award, and it will show as pending on your statement of account until we receive payment from the scholarship provider.
