- 5. Completion of each education (EDUC/SPEC) course with a grade of C (2.0) or above, and completion of EDUC 110, 201, 205, ENGL 110 and COMM 211 with a grade of C (2.0) or above.
- 6. Successful completion of all sections of Praxis I (PPST). See specific testing information listed in the catalog.
- 7. Submission of two letters of recommendation from faculty members outside the Department of Education who have had the candidate as a student in the classroom.
- 8. Submission of an autobiographical statement.
- 9. Completion of a signed professional dispositions contract.
