****REMINDERS****

1. The minimum acceptable grade for all nursing courses (theory, clinical components and support courses) is C (2.0). A nursing course may be repeated only once in attempt to attain the minimum grade. Only one nursing clinical course can be repeated.
 2. Nursing courses must be taken in sequence and are taught only one time per year.
 3. Nursing students must maintain at least a 2.75 cumulative GPA to continue in the nursing program.
- Note: Please enroll all nursing majors in PSYC 101 (needed as a prerequisite for Dev Psych) and in EXSC 240 (required support course). If students need to enroll in developmental courses, a five year plan of study is recommended.

ADMISSION TO SOPHOMORE PROFESSIONAL CLINICAL COMPONENT

Freshmen are admitted to the College as Pre-nursing majors. Admission to the Sophomore Professional Clinical component of the curriculum is based on: 1) review of the nursing application 2) the achievement of a cumulative grade point of 3.25 or higher, 3) completion of BIOL 151, 152 and PSYC 238 with a C (2.0) or higher, 4) completion of health form (forms available in nursing department), and 5) evidence of current CPR certification; negative TB test and a criminal background evaluation.

➤Freshmen are admitted to the College as Pre-Nursing majors.

➤A 3.25 cum GPA is required for enrollment in sophomore professional clinical component.

➤Students must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or better and earn a C (2.0) or better in each support course and in each Nursing course before proceeding in the program. A course with an unsatisfactory grade may be repeated only once. Only one clinical Nursing course may be repeated.

➤Nursing courses must be taken in sequence and are taught only once each year.

➤The following limits apply when counting hours applicable toward the 120 required for graduation – 4 hours of physical activity (EXSC) and 8 hours of MUSC 149.

➤Except in specifically approved majors, a maximum of 52 hours in an academic discipline may count toward graduation. Three hours over the limit may count to accommodate an internship in the discipline.
