Footnotes & Clarifications:

*WVWC MA in Counseling has set our CECE pass rate as one standard deviation below the mean. All 6 December graduates passed the CECE on their first attempt. 5 of the 6 July Graduates passed on their first attempt.

**The pass rate is for students and graduates who registered to take the National Counselor Examination for Licensure and Certification (NCE) through the National Board for Certified Counselors (NBCC). 5 out of 6 initial December 2025 graduates have taken the NCE thus far (4 passed on first attempt, 5th passed on second attempt). 4 out of 5 July 2026 graduates have taken the NCE thus far (all 4 passed on first attempt).

***Because this program includes both full-time and part-time delivery options and our earliest cohorts have not yet reached the institution's 4-year time-to-degree benchmark, a completion rate is not yet calculable. To date, 10 students have graduated (all from the full-time track); 4 of the remaining students across our two active cohorts are part-time students. They remain in progress within their 4-year completion window. A formal completion rate will be reported once each cohort reaches its expected completion date.
